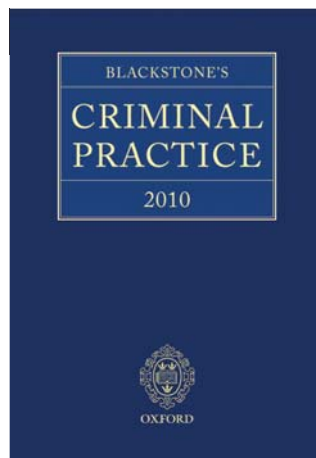

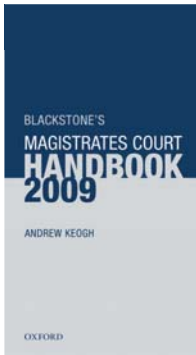


David Ormerod is Professor of Criminal Justice, at Queen Mary, University of London and a Barrister at 18 Red Lion Court, London.
