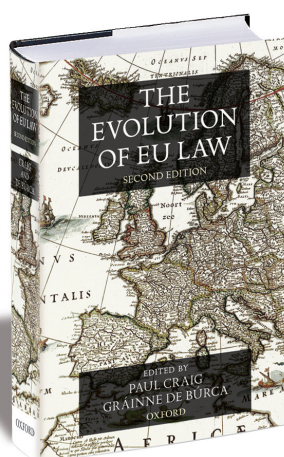

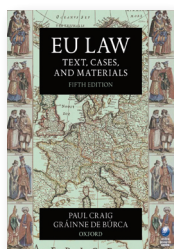

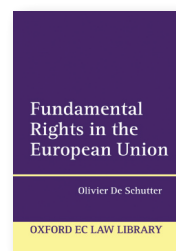
Fundamental Rights in the European Union
