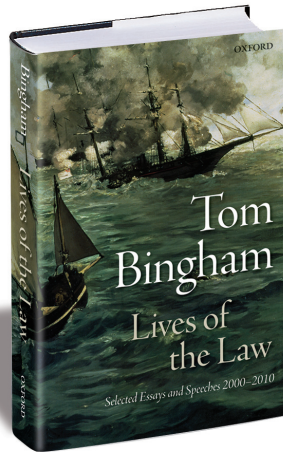
Lord Tom Bingham, Former Senior Law Lord

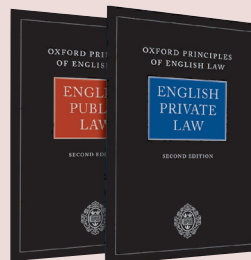
