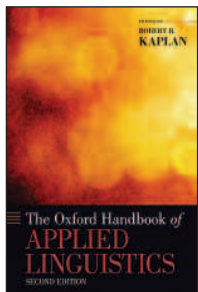

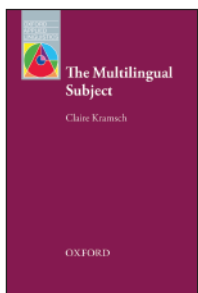

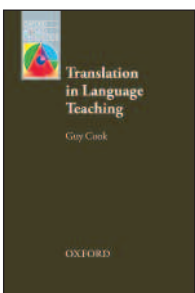
By drawing on multiple

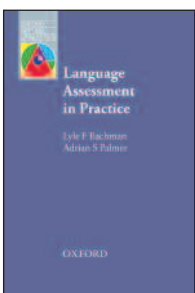

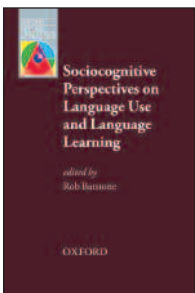
