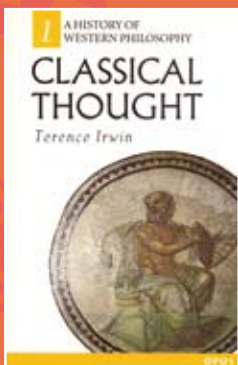

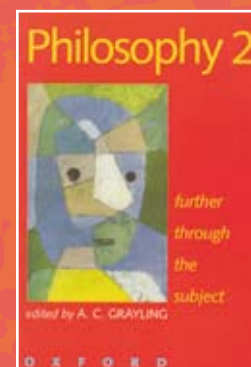
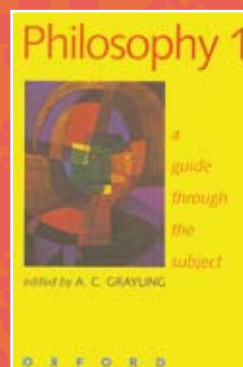
PHILOSOPHY 1 A GUIDE THROUGH THE SUBJECT
