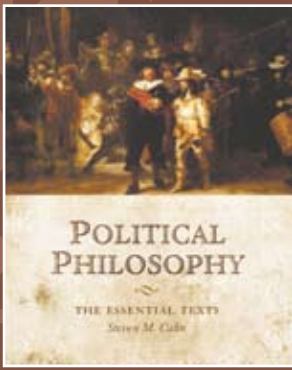

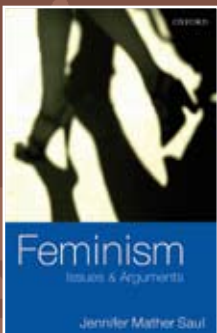

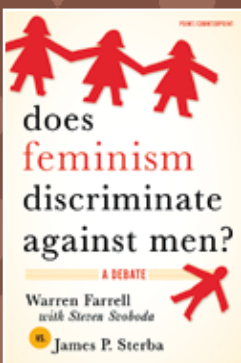
FEMINISM: Issues and Arguments

BERLIN: LIBERTY 2ND EDITION



Isaiah Berlin, late Professor of Social and Political Theory, and Fellow of All Souls College, Oxford Edited by Henry Hardy, Fellow of Wolfson College, Oxford

Liberty is a revised and expanded edition of the book that Isaiah Berlin regarded as his most important - *Four Essays on Liberty*, a standard text of liberalism, constantly in demand and discussion since it was first published in 1969.

Berlin's editor Henry Hardy has revised the text, incorporating a fifth essay and adding further pieces that bear on the same topic, so that Berlin's principal statements on liberty are at last available together in one volume. Finally, by way of preface and appendices drawn from Berlin's unpublished writings, he exhibits some of the biographical sources of Berlin's lifelong preoccupation with liberalism.
