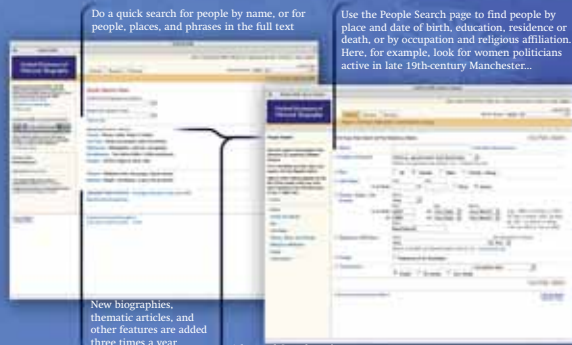

- The online edition provides an extensive range of search and browse options, making it possible to explore the *Oxford DNB* with great speed and ease. Articles and search results can be printed and emailed.
- Excellent internal cross-referencing, and links to external websites such as the National Register of Archives and the National Portrait Gallery make it an invaluable research tool.
- New biographies are added three times a year in online updates, with coverage now extending into the 21st century.
- Updates also include an expanding range of thematic reference materials, creating an online companion guide to British history in the widest sense.
- Themes include feature articles, from Roman Britain to South Africa; lists of office holders, from English cricket captains to colonial and post-independence leaders of Australia; and essays on historical groups, from the Founding Knights of the Garter to the members of the Ealing Studios. These provide exciting paths through the *Oxford DNB*'s content.



Do a quick search for people by name, or for people, places, and phrases in the full text

Use the People Search page to find people by place and date of birth, education, residence or death, or by occupation and religious affiliation. Here, for example, look for women politicians active in late 19th-century Manchester...

A search for Churchill produces 30 results which you can re-order by birth or death date, or search again in many ways



Illustrated articles are easy to find - and you can choose to view illustrated articles only

New biographies, thematic articles, and other features are added three times a year

Advanced Search options open up even more research possibilities - for example, People Search

Articles can be printed and emailed, and citation information is also available

Subheadings make it possible to browse long biographies with ease

Move to biographies of other people mentioned in the article

Compare the new article on Churchill with the entry in the original *DNB*

The *Oxford DNB* also contains an expanding range of articles on particular themes - and Winston Churchill is mentioned in several, including Chancellors of the exchequer

Direct links to external web sites such as the National Portrait Gallery, the National Register of Archives, and the Royal Historical Society bibliography open up further research possibilities



A Quick Search box is available on every webpage

The invaluable references section includes a list of sources, plus details of where to find archive material relating to Churchill (including film and sound) and portraits. You can also find out his wealth at death!
