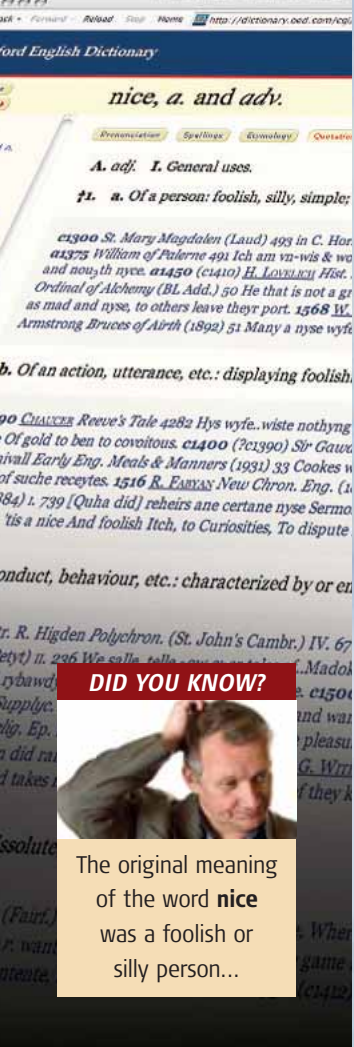

- **Quick search** by word or phrase from every web page
- **Advanced search options** open up wide research avenues – perform case sensitive and Boolean searching, or search for a particular part of speech
- **Search for words originating from another language**, and/or during a particular period – for example, how many words came into English from Urdu during the 1970s?
- **Search for first cited authors and works** – for example, how many words were first recorded in the works of Shakespeare?
- **Use wildcards** if you are unsure of a spelling or want to search for words with particular characteristics
- **Browse** the *Dictionary* using alphabetical entry lists, and take advantage of extensive internal cross-referencing links
- **Entries can be bookmarked** for later use, **printed**, and **emailed** to colleagues and friends
