Can you think of any other words like this?

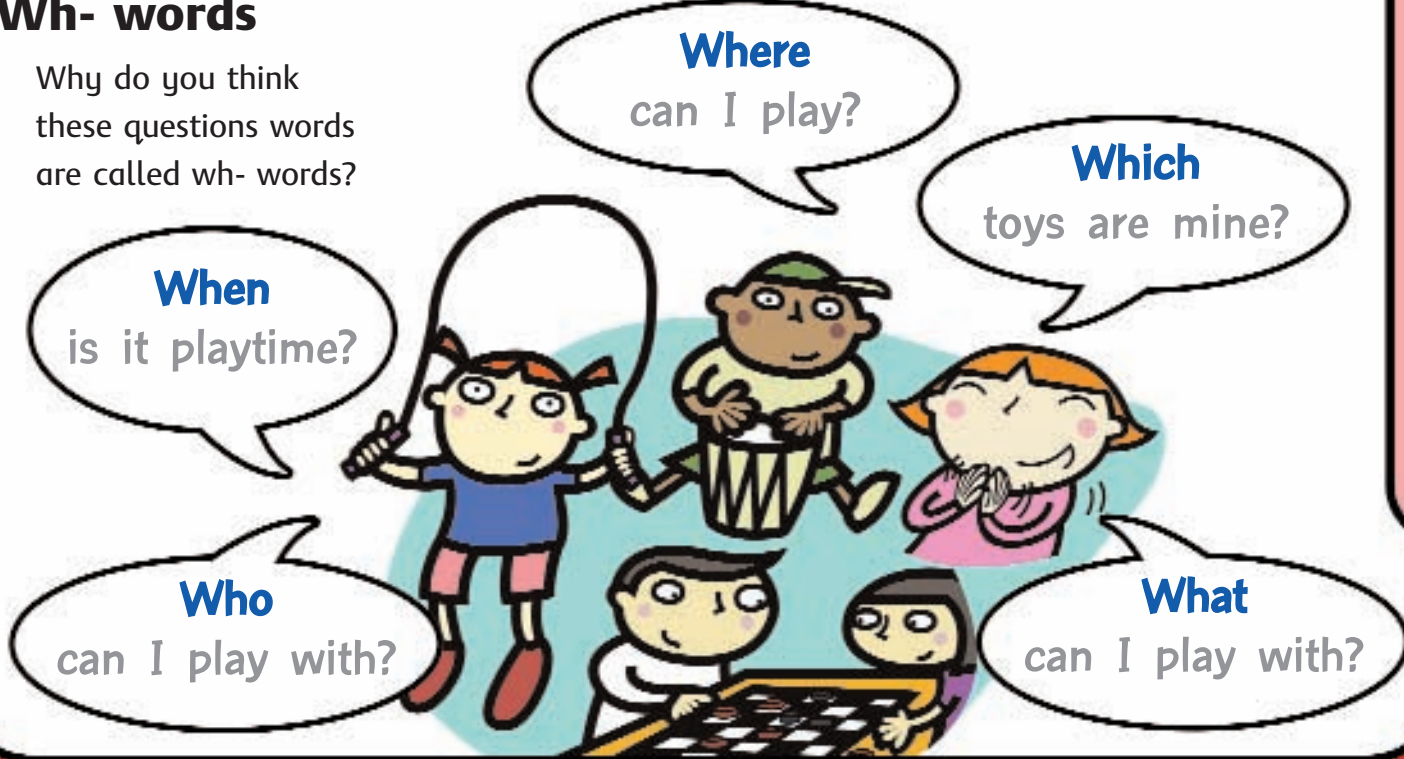

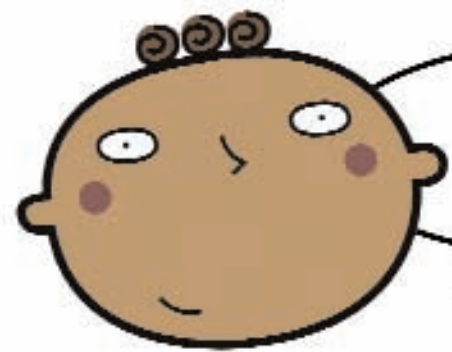


PUNCTUATION

Nouns are naming words.

Verbs

Verbs are things that you are doing, having, or being.

Every sentence must have a verb. Most sentences have nouns.



Cheetahs run fast.

Cheetahs **run** fast.

The **boy** is jumping.

The boy is **jumping**.

Ahmed has black hair.

Ahmed **has** black hair.
