

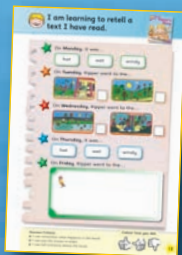
# How to use Oxford Reading Tree MagicPage in your classroom

Move seamlessly from shared work on screen to group and independent work on paper.

## STEP 1

### Talk

- ★ Images, audio and film stimulate Speaking and Listening, and prepares children for reading the story
- ★ High quality cross-curricular films linked to every story making cross-curricular work easy
- ★ Shared Speaking and Listening work on screen links to independent writing activities in the *I can* books



## STEP 5 and 6

### Edit and Change

- ★ Changing plot, characters or settings, and editing text on screen offers opportunities for you to focus on word, punctuation, sentence and story structure
- ★ Enables you to link to your shared group and independent writing sessions
- ★ Oxford Reading Tree MagicPage tools let you annotate, edit, save and print every story!



## STEP 2 and 3

### Read and About

- ★ Shared reading on screen, and film clips of the author and illustrator, help children learn more about the story, and link to group and independent reading with the print story book
- ★ Turn-the-page technology lets you read the story like a real book, but with on screen tools



## STEP 4

### Explore

- ★ Explore the story and select activity hot spots on screen to access Word Recognition and Language Comprehension activities
- ★ Move from shared language Comprehension and Word Recognition activities on screen to independent practice in the *I can* books
