Children's resources are attractive, teacher resources are straightforward and easy to use. The methodology is focused and systematic, but is not purely about phonics. It incorporates many elements of language and literacy - the children work on punctuation, grammar etc. as they edit, they are required to think carefully about the meaning of the texts, to think beyond the literal, and they are introduced to a variety of readable texts and writing genres. Whilst the lessons are separate from our Units of Inquiry, they allow the children to learn language, to learn about language, and to learn through language - a requirement of good language development and the PYP. The lessons help the children to develop many of the tools they need for an inquiry based curriculum.
