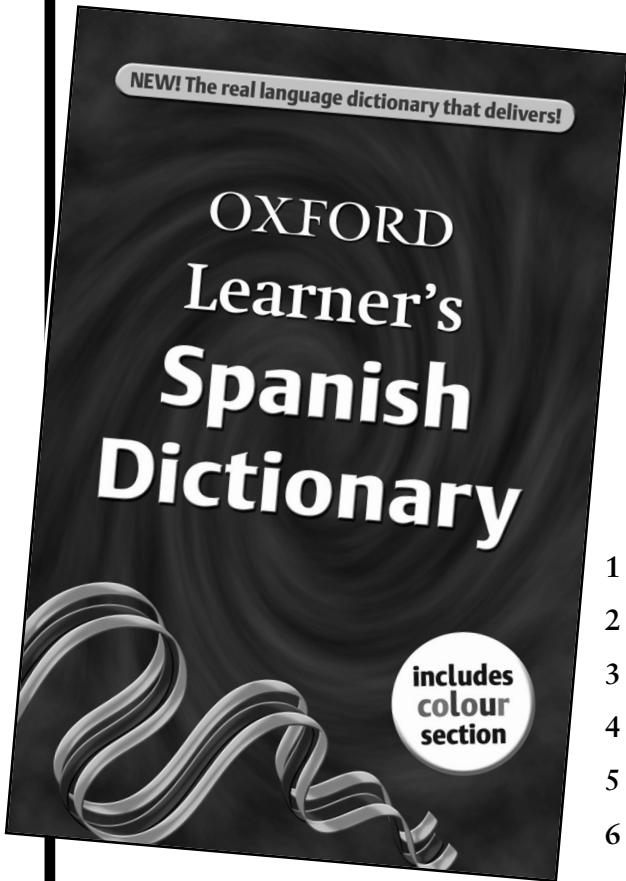
Introducción
